Amazing though it may seem, until now it was apparently illegal to take a pushchair into a playground run by the municipal councils. Or to dress too skimpily at one of their swimming pools.

And anyone who visited their toilets too often could be charged with loitering under yet another outdated provision still on the statute books.

Given how it ardently opposed abolishing the municipal councils, the Democratic Party could easily have refused to cooperate in sweeping away such anomalies. Instead it played a constructive role in yesterday's debate, forcing a sometimes-reluctant administration to make the necessary changes.

our best to identify inadequacies and improve upon them.'

It was not always easy. Even on non-political issues, the Government was obstructionist, halting efforts to cap charges for street traders, who will now be left to the mercy of bureaucrats.

But it could not block everything. So, thanks to amendments from the Democrats, parents are now free from prosecution for using pushchairs. As are those who spend too long in public toilets.

After all, if the Government had been in any danger of losing it would simply have bullied the Democratic Alliance for the Betterment of Hong Kong into another U-turn. Just to be sure, scores of officials were posted outside the council chamber, to keep track of their voting fodder.

Banker David Li was rushed back in with only a few seconds to spare before the final vote. One bureaucrat pointed with a smile to the unexpectedly empty seat of Provisional Regional Council chairman Lau Wong-fat, who strongly opposes abolition.

The Democrats may have been doomed to lose. But at least they could take heart that their careful scrutiny had helped make a bad bill marginally better.

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Politicians split on who should call shots on art

OLITICIANS are divided over who should be responsible for decisions on the display of controversial pieces of art in public such as the Pillar of Shame statue.

There was no consensus on whether it should be the duty of the government's soon-to-be-set-up Culture and Heritage Commission or a non-statutory advisory

The newly created Department of Leisure and Cultural Services is said to be considering setting up an advisory committee to advise the government on the operation of leisure and cultural services.

Democratic Party legislator Cheung Man-kwong, also a standing committee member of the Hong Kong Alliance in Support of Patriotic Democratic Movements of China, said such a committee should be drawn from representatives of the cultural sector.

Mr Cheung said the crucial point - the display of works of art such as the Pillar of Shame and other controversial items that depict human sex organs - would depend very much on the composition of the proposed advisory committee.

"If the members are solely appointed by the government, undoubtedly their

thinking would be close to that of the government, in which case they would only 'act like a decorative vase' of the

"These appointees would then follow the government line in scrutinising applications concerning the display of art in public," he said.

He was concerned that, under such a scenario, the display of works in future would be completely controlled by the

Mr Cheung proposed that an advisory committee be created by the cultural sector, with some directly elected legislators or district councillors who are also experts or professionals in the field

He said he was not worried that the new department would reject an application by the alliance to have the Pillar of Shame publicly displayed during commemorative activities to mark the anniversary of the June 4, 1989, Tiananmen Square crackdown.

The alliance has in recent years managed to display the Pillar of Shame at Victoria Park for a brief period before and after the candlelight vigil to commemorate the crackdown.

On other occasions, the work has been displayed at local universities.

A government consultancy has suggested that a number of non-statutory advisory committees be established under the Department of Leisure and Cultural Services to strengthen its operations.

The committees may comprise experts and practitioners in the relevant fields, businessmen, professionals, exmunicipal councillors, and others," the consultancy report said.

Former provisional urban councillor Tommy Cheung Yu-yan of the Liberal Party supported the consultancy's pro-

Mr Cheung said a similar practice had been adopted by the provisional urban council before it was scrapped.

He said the former council had frequently sought advice from experts and professionals on various cultural

"I think the new department should not waste this pool of expertise already in existence and instead should be striving to recruit more people with such knowledge. The government is not an expert in this sector," Mr Cheung said.

Frontier legislator Cyd Ho Sau-lan said

an independent body should be set up to scrutinise relevant applications.

"But government officials should not sit on the advisory committee as they are likely to come under political pressure from Beijing if they need to make a decision on controversial issues, such as allowing the Pillar of Shame to be displayed in public," Ms Ho said.



"The most appropriate way is to let the government scrutinise applications in accordance with its policy on cultural affairs," Mr Chan said.

"Otherwise, there would be more controversies, and issues would become politicised if more bodies are set up."

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

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

八九民運不單是中國現代史上重要一頁,對香港亦有深遠的影響。民運爲不慣沾上政治的香港藝術界,帶來政治的覺醒,把一向鬆散的本地藝術界,團結於一共同的理想和感受中,也是首次切實地考慮利用藝術參與政治。自三、四十年代因抗日或國共內戰而在香港出現的政治藝術後,政治性藝術這傳統在香港迅速消減,直至四十年後因民運而再生。

六四的符號

最積極活躍的支持民運組織,要算是以新一代藝術工作者為骨幹的「藝援」。當時主要活動,是利用藝術上的技能從事宣傳工作,較突出的有「海報聲援行動」及「民主藝塘」。兩者的主要行動範圍均在香港,只能說爲本地支持民運活動扮演鼓吹和支援角色,對國內民運活動並無任何具體影響。

民運期間傳統政治性藝術的 agi - pro(激動-宣傳)角色,與電視現場直播相比,顯得貧弱無比,而當時香港市民情緒之高漲亦毋須再用藝術激發。在大衆傳媒發達的現代社會,傳統形式的政治性藝術,除非有效地搭上新的傳媒網絡,否則很難再具十九世紀中至二十世紀那份影響力。當然,除了用藝術作激動宣傳外,也不排除藝術工作者需藉藝術宣泄感受的這股衝動。但在聲援民運期間,香港藝術界並未能製造出與民運有關的鮮明形象。





ClientPILLAR OF SHAME AT 69, Hong Kong's leading prodemocracy activist, Szeto Wah, is still going strong.

So too, it seems, is the Hong Kong Alliance in Support of the Patriotic Democratic Movements of China, which he has headed from its formation 11 years ago.

Attendances at commemorative events for student protests and the crackdown in 1989 might be dwindling, but Mr Szeto believes that, deep down, Hong Kong people still support his organisation and will continue to

That is why he intends to continue as alliance chairman - a job he's retained uncontested every year.

"It's not my problem that nobody comes out to challenge me," he said. "It reflects that they are willing to have me as their chairman, and I'm willing to do it."

In fact, the veteran legislator and Democratic Party whip says it is the last job he will give up when he decides to step back from activism.

For now, he says, it is important to educate the new generation about what happened in 1989.

This has been the theme of commemoration rallies this year. Last Sunday, 18 children led the alliance's annual parade with a banner carrying the slogan: "Passing the torch from one generation to the next. Reverse the June 4 verdict."

Mr Szeto reckons the message will eventually get through to leaders in Beijing and that the democracy movement will be vindicated. "But we should also prepare ourselves psychologically that it may be a long-term battle before China has democracy."

While Mr Szeto is optimistic, there

have been rumblings within the alliance over the lack of a successor as chairman as well as concerns about fewer volunteers and funding.

Most of the alliance's money comes from public donations. One insider said that the organisation had \$3 million in hand — enough to run for two years - before this year's rallies.


The biggest expense are June 4 rallies. And the alliance has been seeking an office as it is about to lose its headquarters in Causeway Bay.

It was concerns over money that meant the Pillar of Shame was not transported from the University of Hong Kong to Victoria Park for last night's vigil.

Students rally to 'freedom' cause the state of the state

The reaction on HKU's campus to the Robert Chung affair and the associated public fallout has been immediate, loud and clear. Yenni Kwok reports

THE RECENT controversy about arrival, before they pitched camp academic freedom is quite possibly the biggest drama that has faced Hong Kong students since that of Tiananmen Square in 1989. At stake is the reputation of their institutions and therefore the value of their studies. It has invited much public debate, not only about the independence of Hong Kong campuses, but about how far the students have gone or will go in their protests and demands about this matter.

Though staff are clearly involved, the strongest reaction has come from the students. "The staff have more limitations than the students," said Chris Lo Wai-ming, spokesman of the Hong Kong Federation of Students, which has been involved in recent protests with the University of Hong Kong (HKU) Students Union. "Many work on a contract basis, and because the vice-chancellor signs their contracts, they are afraid they will not be renewed."

The students have no such worries. On July 14, HKU pollster Robert Chung Ting-yiu revealed that his vice-chancellor was the third party who, he said, had delivered the message that Chief Executive Tung Chee-hwa was un-happy with Dr Chung's polls on his popularity and the Government's performance. Within hours, the university's students staged a protest demanding the vice-chancellor, Professor Cheng Yiu-chung, step down.

When Professor Cheng flew home from Britain a few days later, nearly 20 students from the HKU Students Union and the federation were involved in a chase which began at the airport, where they waited several hours for his

overnight outside his home.

Professor Cheng finally spoke to them the next morning for five minutes through the gates of his residence. A caller to a radio programme commented that his performance was worse than that of former premier Li Peng when he received students during the Tiananmen rally in Beijing.

Nevertheless, such persistence had not gone down well with some members of the public. In a letter to the South China Morning Post, a reader lambasted the students and compared their behaviour with that of the Red Guards. During a press conference held by the students union, an unidentified man accused them of being sensational and disrespectful to their teacher.

"I don't think our actions are similar to the Red Guards," said Gloria Chang Wan-ki, president of the students union. "Based on this issue alone and the attitude of Professor Cheng, there is enough reason for him to resign from his post. He lacks the initiative and the intention to protect academic freedom. Given his past history, surely he needs to bear the responsibilities."

In 1996, Professor Cheng ordered the clean-up of June 4 slogans in support of the Tiananmen students, which were painted on university property, and he also refused to allow the "Pillar of Shame" statue to be erected on campus after the handover.

The students scored victories in both those cases. They repainted the slogans and the statue is now standing in front of Haking Wong building, which houses the students union office.

None of their current demands have been met. Professor Cheng was reluctant to hold a dialogue with the students, or to relinquish his post. The university council also ignored their demand to have the Legislative Council investigate the fiasco.

The students have stuck to these demands but not threatened any further action. "If Professor Cheng has no initiatives, we cannot do anything," said Ms Chang. Instead of militant action or violence, the students have resorted to mischief. Last week they lampooned the characters embroiled in the Robert Chung controversy in a play acted out on the campus grounds.

The Chief Executive was portraved as the "Ignorant Emperor Tung" and his aide Andrew Lo Cheung-on was "Lo the Eunuch". In a play on the sound of their names, Professor Cheng became "Cheng the Evil Spirit", while Mr Chung was "Chung Who Has To

Previously the students union had organised public protests about the right of abode and voiced dissatisfaction with the Government during the handover anniversary. Despite their high profile, the activities drew little student participation, with only about 20 student protesters joined by many non-students. But this time the controversy has sparked a heated debate among students, with both supportive and critical opinions of how student leaders have reacted.

On campus the affair has proven to be the hottest issue for student activists in recent years. Ms Chang recalled 'several episodes in which fellow students

The Internet has proved a powerful tool to reach the students during their summer holiday. "Most students are not on campus during the summer holiday, but we have a lot of discussions on our Web site and news group," said Christopher Fung Ka-keung, vice-president of the Chinese University Students

Last week the academic freedom controversy also shook the Chinese University after it was discovered that vice-chancellor Arthur Li Kwok-cheung had also met Mr Tung's aide, Mr Lo, to discuss the reappointment of a council member.

Yet despite the huge interest,

the activists generally believe that the controversy will not make the campus more active than before.

This really raises the students' interest, but I don't think the whole atmosphere is changing or that students will actively participate in each campaign," said Yuen Hoi-yan, external vice-president of the HKU Students Union.

"Every year, the issues [under discussion in the students' union is different," said Mr Fung. "This year, we stress academic freedom.

However, Ms Chang said she hoped the controversy could be used to encourage more student involvement in campus affairs. She and her fellow activists are now pushing for further democratisation of the campus, including a ballot so students and university staff can elect the university's vice-chancellor.

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

Last May, Galschiot also erected a pillar in the village of Acteal in Chiapas, Mexico, where forty-five unarmed indigenous people were killed by a paramilitary group on December 22, 1991 (bottom, right corner). Galschiot says he plans to sculpt one pillar a year "as a memorial of infringement against humanity."

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港大學生會忽視 雕塑剝

四事件一直是不少香港人的包袱,想不到,悼念六四惨案的藝術品 殤之柱愛理不理,任由它風吹雨打,雕塑上的頭和手腳不斷脫落,「殘肢」 更慘被學生誤為垃圾棄掉,此柱實命途多舛。 被遺棄在垃圾堆填區的剝落部分,位於柱的正中央,原本爲其中一張扭 曲的臉孔及殘缺不全的肢體部分,據港大學生會會長魏詠賢表示,柱身損 毀乃由於年前由科大校園運至理大校園展出期間,在搬運過程中遇意外 跌下造成

魏詠賢對事件也感歉意,但就自我安慰地表示「不去修補 也有不去修補」的好處,比如「能保留國殤之柱曾巡迴各間 大學的歷史記憶」,且柱身損毀後未有胡亂作修補,亦算是 「夐重原創者的創作」等等。

曾被視作捍衛人權象徵

原本由五十張痛苦臉孔和扭曲身體堆砌而成的國殤之柱。 直被視作捍衛人權的圖騰,甚至港大學生會亦曾爲國殤之柱 能否在校内豎立策動全民投票、與校長僵持不下,不過隨着學 生會多次改選,昔日學生對國殤之柱的信念及堅持,似亦隨 時日淡下來。

對於這座象徵人權受侵犯和被壓逼的大型雕塑,一直 反對在校內豎立的港大校長固然撒手不管·就是名義上擁有 該雕塑的支聯會,以及一手促成國殤之柱在港大永久豎立的 港大學生會、均亦未有爲該座柱高達八米的雕塑作定期檢查 及維修,任其在學生會會址對出的黃克競平台日灑雨淋,導 致柱身「殘肢」被視作垃圾丟掉

記者曾就國殤之柱的維修檢查問題分別向港大校長、支聯 會及學生會查詢。港大校長回覆謂「學生當年堅持要在該處豎 立大型雕塑,並無按正常程序向校長申請,故校長不會也不 能擔當維修及檢查的角色」,發言人並重申;年前校長早已 就國殤之柱的安全問題發表遺憾聲明,指責學生罔顧颱風逼

支聯會「阿牛」:「毋須維修」

至於過去一直有協助將國殤之柱移師到全港各處展覽的 支聯會成員曾健成則表示、「由於該雕塑無顯著剝落的問題 故暫無需要維修一,本身從事地盤工作的「阿牛」承認過 去國殤之柱的檢查工作均由他一手包辦・主要是「睇吓有無 批盪跌下」等等

雖然這座原名爲「恥辱之柱」的雕塑已處於三不管狀態 但其實學生會亦意識到潛在的危險性,除了工人以銅纜罩 固之外,也已爲雕塑購買第三者保險

丹麥藝術家高志活創作了高八米的國殤之柱運抵本港,以五十張痛苦 的臉孔和扭曲了的身體堆砌成,柱底刻了「六四層城」和「將死不能殺 害方生」字樣,以悼念八九年天安門事件。

首次竪立在維圖的悼念六四燭光晚會,當晚有五萬市民參加。其後連 續十個月在七間大學巡回擺放,在還往港大時,遭校方阻撓,最後成功 近的危險性 九七年六月四日 擺放在港大黃克競樓平台展覽。

臨時市政局否決支聯會申請,把國殤之柱放在九龍公園的雕塑廊展出。同時,港大學生會向校方申請在校內永久擺放國殤之柱。

國際之柱在六四燭光晚會後,無容身之所,被道機身在馬鞍山貨櫃場。

國殤之柱終還入港大校園,但只能橫放在該校黃克競樓關於學生管理 的有蓋平台。

港大學生會把團聽之柱豎立起來,並以書面形式知會校方,校方其後向校務會提出討論圖殤之柱事件,但未有決議。在「六四」十周年晚會, 一名「行為藝術家」向擺放在維團的國殤之柱淋紅漆。

正當鍾庭輝民調事件鬧得沸沸揚揚之際,學生會指港大校長前後兩年 與學生會定期會面時,都提出學生會須向校方申請擺放國殤之柱,疑校長受特首施壓,但行政長官辦公室則否認有其事。


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支聯會成立青年組交棒

支聯會在昨日「六四」事件十二周年,一如往年在銅鑼灣維園舉行燭光悼念晚會,今年市民反應較預期為好,參加悼念晚會有四萬八千人,較去年增加

三千人;另外,支聯會決定成立支聯會青年組,希望能「教育下一代,接好民主棒」。



於以往舉行燭光晚會的石屎足球場,要進行維修,故今年較特別之處是,搬到草地舉行晚會,昨晚七時開始,已陸續有市民到來,並手持蠟燭,悼念晚會約在八時三十分開始,大會播放民運錄影帶,支聯會主席司徒華向擺在草地上的民主烈士碑獻上花圖,跟着並燃點火炬要求平反六四。

人數較去年增三千

雖然警方預計昨晚會有三萬至五萬 人到維團集會,但支聯會宣布今年參加 悼念晚會共有四萬八千人,較去年四萬 五千人,增加三千人。另外,支聯會宣 布成立支聯會青年組,招募十五至二十 五歲青年參加,支聯會主席司徒華表 示,由去年開始,支聯會提出新口號就 是新火相傳,教育下一代,接好民主 棒,希望青少年能認識六四事件。 另外,雖然香港及海外華人仍有舉 行六四紀念活動,而國際特赦組織亦力 促中國對六四事件進行公平和公開調查,不過隨着時間的過去,各地民眾對 六四事件的態度日漸轉趨冷淡,出席參 與六四紀念活動的人也不斷減少。

內地優經濟無紀念

其中內地的民眾似乎已完全淡忘此 事,當地幾乎沒有公開紀念六四的迹 象。北京一學者說,當前中國社會以發 展經濟為先,六四只屬於過去的歷史。

而周日晚參與紐約六四紀念會的魏 京生亦認為,六四事件已經過去十二年 了,追悼活動漸漸淡去也是一件正常 事,但他們不會忘記當日犧牲的人。

當晚在紐約中國領事館前舉行的悼 念活動共有約二百人參加。本月二日晚 洛杉磯亦有舉行追悼晚餐會,參加的人 數約有一百人。



Pillar of Shame statue in need of facelift after cracks surface

The Pillar of Shame statue in memory of the June 4 massacre has been left to decay with no immediate plan for a facelift, it has emerged.

But the Alliance in Support of the Patriotic Democratic Movement in China has pledged to help students repair the sculpture, which stands at the University of Hong Kong.

Student leaders also vowed to ensure that the deterioration would not give the university administration an excuse to get rid of the work, which depicts a pile of twisted bodies.

The six-metre statue was made by Danish sculptor Jens Galschiot to commemorate the 1989 crackdown on students in Tiananmen Square. It has been displayed on the podium of the Haking Wong Building since June 1999, despite opposition from the university on safety grounds.

Cracks and holes appeared after the sculpture was left exposed in open air.

Biby Ngai Wing-yin, the president of the University of Hong Kong Students' Union, said some of the damage might have appeared while the sculpture was being transported for temporary display at other universities.

The sculpture's insurance

The sculpture's insurance costs the students' union \$3,000 a year. Ms Ngai said the union might discuss a maintenance plan later but believed the univer-

sity administration would not offer to help.

"The administration thinks that it is embarrassing to place the sculpture on the campus. It won't help us to repair it. But the cracks are no excuse to remove the Pillar of Shame."

Alliance spokesman Lee Cheuk-yan said it would discuss repairs after today's candlelight vigil in Victoria Park.

Mr Lee said the sculpture had been given to the students' union but emphasised that the alliance would help with repairs if necessary. "A facelift is needed after years of wind and rain. The sculpture is commemorative. The artist made it specially and it should be displayed in good shape," he said.
