Need for change

Though the world leaders' agreed to keep CO2 emissions low during COP21 in Paris, we are still not on a course that leaves a planet worth living on for our kids

Trump's denouncement of the COP21 agreement makes it even more obvious that we are heading in the wrong direction.

Climate change is threatening to cause more extreme weather, lack of drinking water and famines, resulting in global instability and a rising number of climate

We need to show the conference delegates how vital their decisions are. We do this through sculptural outcries between the COP-zones and at the demonstrations in

Sculptural Outcries in Bonn

Danish artist Jens Galschiot has a long history of contributing with art to UN climate summits e.g. Johannesburg'92, COP15 in Denmark, Rio+20 in Brazil,

During COP23 Galschiot exhibits a number of art installations in Bonn, highlighting the climate crisis from different angles

Unbearable



A real size polar bear in copper is impaled 6m above ground, on an oil pipeline in shape of a CO2-graph. The sculpture is a visualization of the climate situation.

The graph impaling the bear shows the real cumulative global fossil fuel carbon emissions. Throughout the centuries the graph creeps along the ground then rises dramatically around year 1850 as human consumption of fossil fuels like coal and oil takes off.

Unbearable was first presented at COP21 in Paris' 2015. The summit ended with an ambitious agreement, but since then the CO2-emission has kept rising.
Therefore the CO2 graph that impales the polar bear will be updated with an extension of 27 centimeters in Bonn (see event below)

The sculpture has been exhibited in Paris and in front of the Danish Parliament. After Bonn we plan to bring it to New York as a message to President Trump. Support and contacts for this project is greatly appreciated.

Location: Rheinaue Park in Bonn, at the corner of the lake next to Charles de Gaulle Straße.

Exhibition time: Nov. 3rd - 17th, 2017. Side event: Nov. 15th at 15.30-18.00

Freedom to Pollute (and Trump)

A 6-meter high kitschy replica of the Statue of Liberty emitting smoke from the torch. The document in her hand displays the text 'Freedom to Pollute'.

The sculpture symbolizes the conflict between the western world's concept of freedom, as a right for unbridled consumption versus the concern for the climate and the planet. Do we have the right to live the way we do?

"Donald Trump" drives around with the statue behind his VW convertible at the demonstrations, with the message that the free world has the freedom to pollute.

Location: Various places in Bonn during COP23.

On Nov. 4th climate march at 12.00 at Münsterplatz


On Nov. 11th demonstration at 10.30 by Bonn Central train station

Jens Galschiot

Jens Galschiot, Danish artist and sculptor.

He stakes his art to defend the ethical values of our civilization, regardless of political, religious or eco-

His sculptures suddenly appear in public areas and start the performance.

Best known are My Inner Beast (Europe), the Pillar of Shame (Hong Kong, Mexico, Brazil)and Survival of The Fattest (COP15, Hong Kong).

The last 5 years his The Refugee Ship, a floating art installation with 80 climate refugee in copper, has visited a large part of Scandinavia and more than 30 German cities.

The projects are financed, partly by individuals and organizations, but the larger part of the finances come from the sale of Galschiot's bronze sculptures to art collectors all over the world.

Visit Gallery Galschiot:

Galschiot has a huge industrial area in Odense, Denmark with a bronze foundry, gallery and workshop. The place is open for visitors, with free entry and coffee.
